

Career Resume Summary - Richard A. Eribes, Ph.D., AIA

Richard A. Eribes is a Professor of Architecture and former Dean of the College of Architecture and Landscape Architecture, University of Arizona. He holds the position of Research Professor in the Drachman Institute, the research and community outreach arm of the college.

Over the last ten years, he served as a member of U of A's Planning and Design Review Advisory Committee, and was chair of the Comprehensive Campus Plan Update Steering Committee. He came to the University of Arizona from the University of New Mexico where he was Dean of the School of Architecture and Planning.

Previously, he was both a Professor of Architecture and a Professor of Planning at Arizona State University. He was the former Director of the Herberger Center for Design Excellence and Associate Dean for the College of Architecture and Environmental Design at Arizona State University.

Professor Eribes served as the Assistant Vice President for Planning and Facilities Development for ASU West Campus, where he directed the institutional strategic planning effort and capital improvement process for the new university campus.

He also served as Assistant Dean for Research at ASU's College of Architecture and Environmental Design, as well as the Director of Research and Publications for ASU's School of Public Affairs, and was the first Director of the Center for Urban Studies. Eribes has done extensive research on the pedagogy of architecture, urban design and environmental perception, affordable housing, the California Modernist Movement, and public policy. His design work has been recognized by both the Albuquerque Chapter and the Southern Arizona Chapter of the American Institute of Architects.

He has published extensively, most recently editing with M. Hardin and C. Poster, From the Studio to the Streets: Service-Learning in Planning and Architecture, by the American Association of Higher Education. He is a contributing author in the award winning book Casa y Comunidad (House and Community) by Henry Cisneros, and is featured in Becoming and Architect by Lee Waldrup from John Wiley & Sons.

Before joining academia, Eribes was a practicing architect and planning consultant in the Los Angeles area. He earned his doctorate in Urban Studies in 1977 from the University of Southern California, and also holds both a Bachelor of Architecture and Master of Architecture from USC.
